ABDOMINAL ULTRASOUND

**** HISTORY **:**

Hepatitis C with cirrhosis. Hepatoma screen.

**** FINDINGS **:**

There is a diffuse coarse echogenicity to the hepatic parenchyma. There is marginal nodularity. The appearance is consistent with a cirrhotic liver. No discrete hepatic lesions are identified to suggest the presence of an associated hepatoma.

Several polyps are identified within the gallbladder, the largest of which measures 9 mm in diameter. No gallstones are identified.

The common hepatic duct is of normal caliber. The spleen is at the upper limits of normal in size measuring 13.2 cm in length. The remainder of the exam is unremarkable.

**** IMPRESSION **:**

Negative examination for the presence of a hepatoma. Cirrhotic appearing liver and gallbladder polyps, as noted.
